

Hotel bars. Their party is perpetual. Enter a great one and you'll do more than imbibe — you'll drink in the sum total of the hotel's character, distilled like a handcrafted spirit. Such havens star as the keepers of a hostelry's heart and soul. They can amuse, cosset, and restore. Hatch plans, fall in love, or conclude a business deal with a clink over cocktails. Or simply sink into a stool and nibble a salty snack. *Cin cin* — what are you waiting for?

### **Cocktail Bar**

DROMOLAND CASTLE

It's a fitting way to end a day of falconry. Unofficially, people call the Cocktail Bar at Dromoland Castle in Ireland's County Clare "the kennel" because of the pack of porcelain Staffordshire canines that bedecks the walls. A baron's former library, this cozy octagonal-shaped nook serves up its own artisan pale ale and has an outstanding collection of single-malt whiskeys. While you sip, muse over the history of the O'Brien clan, who ruled the environs for centuries. Or, join some Irish balladeers in an impromptu round of song.



**CHECK IN:** A real castle, replete Hotel with turrets, crenellations, mysterious passageways, and an expanse of land near Shannon tantamount to an empire. Dromoland exudes the regal spirit. Tuck into a two-tiered tower room with views of the 1,000-year-old estate. Tea in china pots and scones with clotted cream rule this 100-room resort, where guests shoot skeet, golf, or indulge in an Irish seaweed treatment at the spa. Take advantage of the famed

falconry program, where the hawks are so well trained they can deliver rings at a wedding ceremony. Virtuoso guests receive a room upgrade upon arrival, if available; breakfast daily for two; and a \$100 foodand-beverage credit. From \$285 per room, per night.

#### **Agave Azul**

#### ROSEWOOD MAYAKOBA

✤ At this sexy bar on Mexico's Riviera ▲ Maya, a tequilier (think agave sommelier) will lead you through a tequila tasting – not to mention a menu full of thirst-quenching, artful concoctions (highly recommended: the savory rosemary margarita). Or, choose something from the tequila library, then read the label – as you would a good book – while nibbling ceviche or small pan-Asian plates that pair nicely with the smooth burn of a wisely chosen reposado.

Rosewood Mayakoba sits on a series of canals and uses water taxis to transport

Agave Azul's guests throughout the property. Enwrapped by a mangrove jungle, the 128-room resort boasts a

mile-long beach, an 18-hole Greg Norman golf course, an in-room tequila welcome, and a spa that occupies its own island. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade CHECK IN: Like a Mexican Venice, upon arrival, if available; daily breakfast for two; and a \$100 spa credit. From \$475 per room, per night.

- Museum of Romanticism: return to the 19th century going round the rooms of this house museum, which recreates the most romantic settings through works of art.
- Cerralbo Museum: at this house museum you will discover the life and collection of the marguis of Cerralbo and feel like a true aristocrat.

# Faré Hoa Beach Bar

#### FOUR SEASONS RESORT BORA BORA

Sometimes nature doesn't really need embellishment. The Faré Hoa Beach Bar could be a bench beneath a palm tree for all you'll care once you catch a glimpse of the scenery. Set beside the resort's pool and overlooking a limpid lagoon, this small, thatched-roof watering hole can't compete with its location. Instead, it provides an unaffected spot to gaze at colossal Mount Otemanu and survey the overwater bungalows that called you here in the first place. Combine the vista with the scent of jasmine and the chirping of exotic birds, and you may find yourself unwilling to leave the water. No worries: The bar's "amphibious server" will swim your cocktail out to you.

**CHECK IN:** Four Seasons Resort Hotel Bora Bora occupies its own motu in leeward French Polynesia. A storybook world of Tahitian dancers, fragrant flowers, and outrigger canoes, its spa, restaurants, and 100 bungalows hover like magic carpets above the lagoon.

Dive from your suite into the sea – or stare down at swimming creatures through a glass-bottomed panel in your living room. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade upon arrival, if available; breakfast daily for two; and a \$100 spa credit. From \$972 per bungalow, per night.

### **Blu Bar on 36**

#### 3 Beer experience



### **O2 Lounge**

THE RITZ-CARLTON, MOSCOW

At dusk, the Muscovite sky turns Bolshoi-ballerina-tutu-pink. Soak it in at the O2 Lounge, a rooftop, alfresco extravaganza that pulses with the party spirit all year long. In winter, belly up to an ice bar, but in more temperate weather, settle into scarlethued, egg-shaped chairs that pay homage to Fabergé. Wherever you sit, take in Moscow's most touted vistas: Red Square, the Kremlin, and a bevy of onion-domed churches that glint in the fading light. Glass, steel, and leather keep things mod, as do the stylish patrons, many of whom nosh on California rolls at the theatrical sushi bar. Order a bottle of Champagne and your bartender may pop the cork with a dramatic swipe of a sabre the ceremonial way. Note: Don't try this at home.

CHECK IN: On Tverskava Street, Moscow's most famous thoroughfare, the 334room Ritz-Carlton is steps from Red Square and is as elaborate as a palace. French mirrors adorn the gilt-laden lobby; twinkling Swarovski crystals illuminate the spa's swimming pool; and marble and cherry wood outfit guestrooms, which include a bulletproof Presidential Suite. VIP airport service eases stressful transfers. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade upon arrival, if available; breakfast daily for two; and one complimentary afternoon tea per stay. 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### **Bar do Copa**

COPACABANA PALACE

Step through a glittering birdcage and into a futuristic fantasyland of see-and-be-seen nightclub action that flanks Copacabana Palace's storied swimming pool. As voluptuous as Rio itself, the nightlife here is fueled by a DJ and hedonistic cocktails flecked with gold and dotted with caviar.

#### The St. **Regis Bar**

THE ST. REGIS ATLANTA

Kitted out like a British gentlemen's club from Victorian times, this masculine space sports dark wood walls, brown leather chairs, and a mural over the bar of a phoenix rising from the ashes. Nurse a West Paces Mary, a Southern version of a Bloody Mary with okra juice and a green tomato.

### **Bar 228**

#### LE MEURICE

Even when designer Philippe Starck refashioned Paris' Le Meurice in 2007 with an Alice-down-the-rabbit-hole modernity, he maintained Bar 228's original atmosphere as a tribute to the city's Belle Epoque times. With Lavalley frescoes, a ceiling painted to depict the night sky, antique crystal decanters, and leather armchairs, the intimate lounge offers a superb selection of cognac, Dom Pérignon by the glass, and custom cocktails named for fabled guests.

**CHECK IN:** Set like a gem on Hotel rue de Rivoli between the Louvre and place de la Concorde, the 160-room Le Meurice is a little black dress of a hotel, mixing chic boutique with Louis



XVI splendor. Celebrated chef Alain Ducasse, Spa Valmont, and 360-degree views of Paris' rooftops from the Belle Etoile Suite define the City of Light. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade upon arrival, if available; breakfast daily for two; and a \$115 food-and-beverage credit. From \$1,115 per room, per night.

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


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#### **Bemelmans Bar Long Bar**

#### THE CARLYLE

#### As full at happy hour with New Yorkers as with tourists, this compact, Upper East Side tavern would have a speakeasy feel, but for the fanciful murals that embellish its walls. Drink here to renderings by Ludwig Bemelmans, best known as the creator of the Madeline storybooks. Said to have been painted to repay his bar debt, the artworks show the books' characters taking on the terrain of Central Park. And then there are the stellar cocktails.

**CHECK IN:** A refuge among the Hotel residential urbanity off Madison Avenue, The Carlyle defines old-school, New York City grandeur. Steps from Central Park, the 188-room hotel is often haunted by the likes of Woody Allen and his band. White-gloved elevator operators and doormen with bowler hats complete the picture. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade upon arrival, if available; daily breakfast for two; and a \$100 spa credit. Stays in 2014 also garner a complimentary cover charge for two at the bar. From \$720 per room, per night.

52 VIRTUOSO TRAVELER

This British colonial-era gin joint once drew adventurers like Ernest Hemingway and plantation proprietors in need of a Singapore Sling. According to local lore, the now-legendary libation was created here in 1910 by bartender Ngiam Tong Boon to please a lady. Turned out men liked it, too - and soon the recipe became so precious, Boon had to lock it away at night. Nowadays, more than 2,000 Slings get slung daily amid an ambiance that harks back to a Malayan rubber plantation of yore.

**RAFFLES SINGAPORE** 

CHECK IN: Built in 1887, the 103room Raffles Singapore recalls the romance of Far East exotica with period furnishings, liveried Sikh doormen, oriental rugs, and teakwood touches. Virtuoso guests receive an upgrade upon arrival, if available; and daily breakfast for two. From \$544 per the Long Bar in room, per night. anniversar VT "1887" features the hotel's limited



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
